As self-regulating professionals, all implementers are responsible for practising in accordance with the practice documents that their respective College publishes and with relevant legislation.

Remember that the authorizer (physician or NP) has absolute responsibility for ensuring that the delegation is taking place reasonably and without undue risk to the patient. Therefore, the more complex the medical directive, the more trust required in the implementor 's knowledge, skill and judgement.
